Compare the main points of the article and the graph. Then, based on the information in the graph, explain why the article may be wrong.

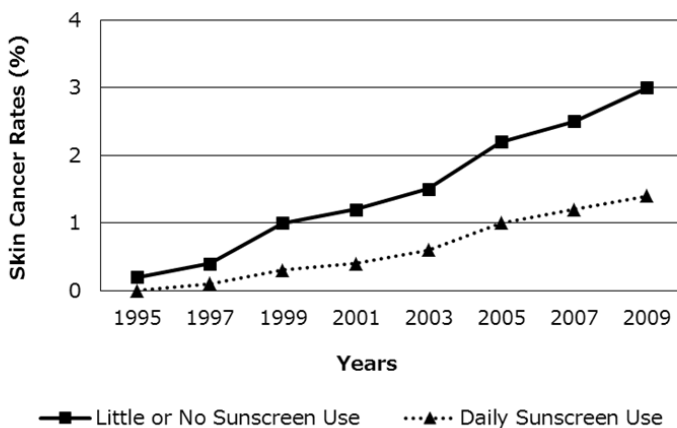

Stop Using Sunscreen

People should stop using sunscreen because its use can increase the risk of skin cancer. People use sunscreen to protect their skin from the sun because it is believed that too much direct sunlight can cause skin cancer. However, instead of preventing skin cancer, using sunscreen actually increases the risk of developing cancer.

Humans need sunlight to make vitamin D, which has many health benefits, including preventing skin cancer. However, the chemicals in sunscreen stop us from getting enough sunlight to make vitamin D. Therefore, people should reduce sun damage in other ways and avoid using sunscreen.

As forests around the world are being cut down to make room for agriculture, many animal species are losing their natural habitats, and their populations are declining as a result.

Gorillas that live in the mountainous forests near the border of Nigeria and Cameroon are no exception. Their diet consists of fruit and the leaves, stems, and bark of trees, but their natural food sources have become scarce.

As these forests become smaller and separated, groups of gorillas are isolated from one another. Gorillas who live in different forests have fewer opportunities to reproduce, further contributing to population decline.
